Common objectives-

Today's children are born into a digital world. They know how to use digital tools from kindergarten. You must be polite and be able to assess the potential consequences of your digital behavior. Our overall goal this month is to make the students become better at being able to behave and see through the communications conditions on the internet.

Overall goal		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - That the students become better at being able to behave and see through the communication conditions on the Internet. - That students become more aware of the possible consequences of different types of behavior online. - That students relate to digital identity, privacy and self-esteem. - That the students get skills and tools to be able to use online media in a good and safe way. - To prevent young people's lives from being negatively affected by the use of online media.
Introduction	5 min	Discuss in the classroom Why is it important to learn about digital behavior?

Group work		<p>Divide the class in groups. Based on the two films and the conversations in the classroom the students must make a poster where they write about the following</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Make a small introduction and write what cyberbullying is- What impact can cyberbullying have on a person's self esteem?- How is it possible to prevent cyberbullying?
Presentation		<p>The groups make their presentations in the classroom and we display their posters at school.</p>
