October 2023 - Achievable goals for greater recycling

Workable and readily available solutions to combat climate change

Climate change is the order of the day. The consequences are a concern for teachers and students. Schools are trying at all costs, and with various activities, to make students aware of this issue, encouraging them to adopt ecological and sustainable attitudes. While a few years ago this issue was only dealt with in a few subjects, such as natural sciences and biology, nowadays this issue is dealt with across the board in all subjects, as it is part of the school guiding documents for the various school years. It is urgent and very important to discuss with our students what is at the root of climate change, to understand the consequences of these changes for life on the planet and how changing our day-to-day conduct can help minimize these consequences.

Educating our students means educating their families and making them aware of environmental issues means making their families and friends aware. This way of approaching the problem is in line with UNESCO, which states that "education encourages changes in attitudes and behavior and helps to adapt to trends linked to climate change". The environmental literacy of the population, which is often unaware of environmental problems and political agreements, is fundamental to changing and improving behavior. One of the key educational issues in the fight against climate change is the role of schools in transmitting environmental principles and promoting a relationship with the environment.



To this purpose, in the various subjects, students carry out research work, information posters, debates, models with recycled materials and exhibitions about environmental change. They also take part in various activities promoted by external organizations.

Once a year, a trade fair is held under the slogan "if you got sick of it, squeezed, forgot it, hid it, let it go", where students, teachers and staff are invited to bring items they no longer use to trade for others of interest. This activity is associated with the commemoration of the Day of Affection, Love and Friendship (*Afeto, Amor e Amizade - 3'As*), while promoting a spirit of sharing and solidarity, raising awareness among the entire school community and, in particular in students of the importance of values such as friendship and respect for others, aiming to build an active and participated citizenship.











Throughout the year, the school raises awareness among students, teachers and staff to the need of adopt sustainable attitudes, promoting a reduction in the use of paper, the waste separation, and the recycling of waste of various origins (paper, plastic, light bulbs, electronic equipment, toners). Students, teachers and staff have at their disposal, in various school spaces, containers where they can deposit various types of waste which will then be collected and processed by the competent authorities.









As a way of reducing water waste and minimizing the consumption of plastic bottles, the various members of the educational community (students, teachers and staff) have two water points at their disposal, where they can fill their bottles with filtered mains water, at room temperature or chilled.

The local water company "Águas de Vila Real de Santo António" has provided all the students with a reusable bottle with the slogan "We are water".









The latest activity for students, staff, teachers and their families is the result of a partnership between the Vila Real de Santo António School Group and the company "Águas de Vila Real de Santo António" and promotes the reduction of paper costs with monthly water bills. The campaign aims to encourage families to sign up to electronic billing. By signing up to the electronic bill, they are contributing to the laying of the floor in the Snoezelen room at VRSA Secondary School. The Snoezelen room is a multisensory room that aims to provide sensory stimulation and/or reduce levels of anxiety and tension. The main aim of our Snoezelen room is to offer our students with greater limitations (cognitive, language or interaction) a space where they can find the human and material resources, they need to establish quality interactions and build meaningful learning.





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
